The National Defence Academy (NDA) is the highest military training and research institution of the Austrian Armed Forces. At the NDA, future officers of the General Staff, officers of higher services (e.g. higher quartermaster and legal advisor service, higher military and military technical service, military doctors) are trained. Military officers of the active class and reserve officers are trained as commanders and staff members of higher levels of leadership. Civilian personnel of the Ministry of Defence and other government departments are trained in security policy, leadership and other subjects.

Research at the NDA covers the main disciplines of senior military leadership (operation, tactics, logistics, command and control and organizational theory); strategy and security policy including international law, arms control and armaments technology; military geography, military sociology, military ethics, military education and military history; peace support and conflict management including analysis of the development of armed forces structures and doctrines. Teaching and research staff of the Academy participate in international committees and conferences commissioned by the Ministry of Defence and maintain close contact with national and international educational and research institutions.

The main departments of the NDA are: Institute for Higher Military Command, Institute for Peace Support and Conflict Management, Institute for Strategy and Security Policy, the Austrian Armed Forces Language Institute and the Centre for People-oriented Leadership and Defence Policy



## GET TO NDA

The two most convenient ways to get to the Academy **from the airport** are:

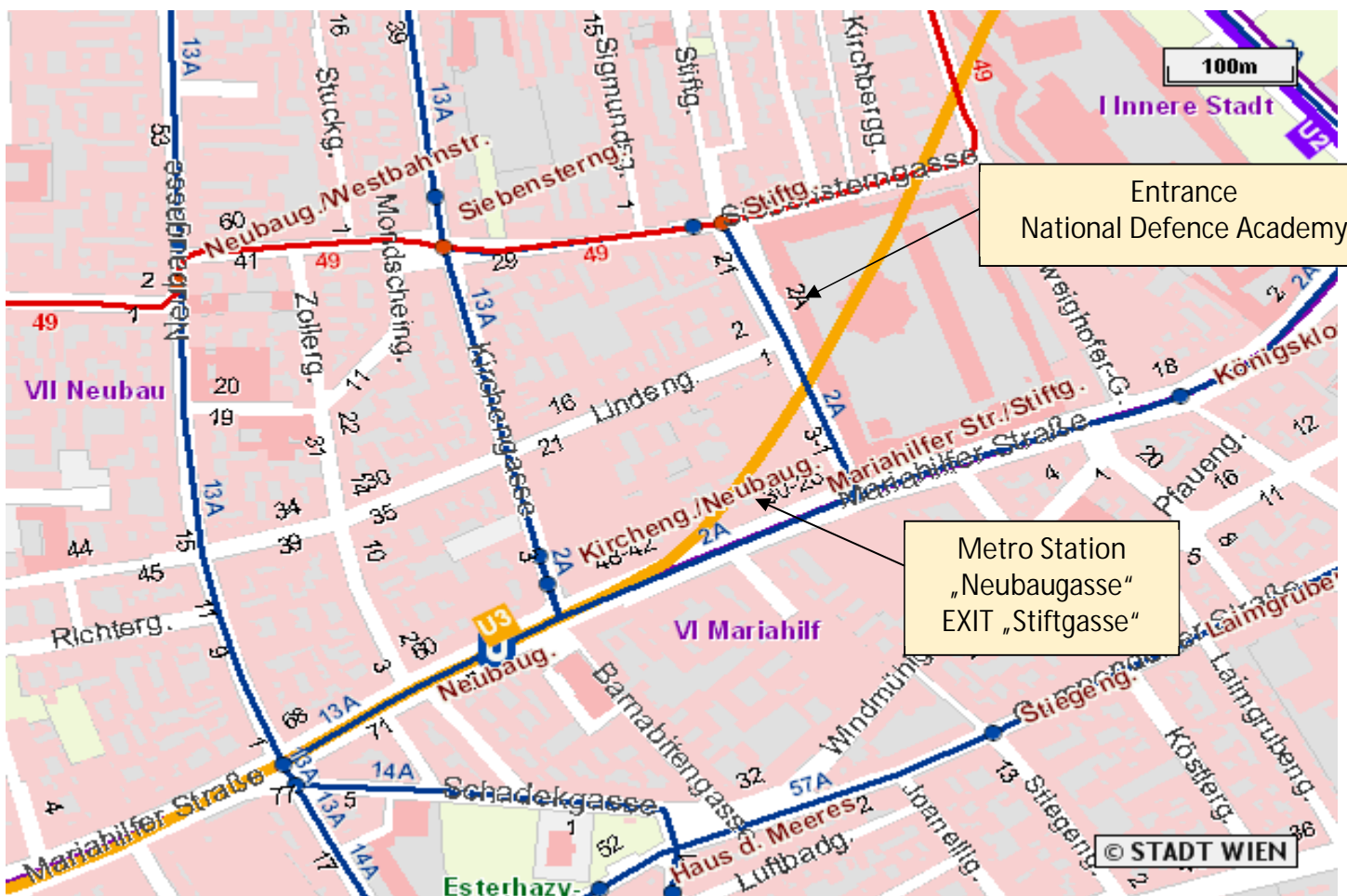
- The City Airport Train (CAT), leaving every 30 minutes.
- The local train, called "S-7", leaving also every 30 minutes.

Both trains stop at the station **Landstraße Wien-Mitte (Vienna City Center)**. From there, take the **metro U3** towards "Ottakring" and get off at the station **"Neubaugasse"** (Exit "Stiftgasse"). You will find the Academy at the crossing Siebensterngasse – Stiftgasse (see also the attached map).

Both variants have a journey time of approx. 38–45 min.

There are two ways to get to the Academy **from the main railway station ("Hauptbahnhof")**:

- First, you could take the **metro U1** towards "Lepoldau", change at "Stephansplatz" to metro **U3** towards "Ottakring" and get off at the Station "Neubaugasse" (Exit "Stiftgasse"). This journey will take approx. 12 min. (recommended)
- The second option is the **bus line 13A** towards "Skodagasse". Get off at "Mariahilfer Straße/Stiftgasse", from there it is a 7-min.-walk to the NDA. This journey will take approx. 30 min.



## ACCOMMODATION

As Vienna experiences a huge influx of tourists make sure you book your flight and accommodation in advance. There are many options of accommodation (hotels, hostels and Airbnb) depending on your budget and preferences.

To enter Austria, you may need a Passport and/or a Visa, depending on the country you live in. It is not possible to apply for a visa at the border. Attendees who need to apply for a visa must do so in their country of residence. Citizens from the European Community don't need a Visa for entering Austria.

**GET TO VIENNA****By plane**

Vienna's airport, "Vienna International Airport" (VIE), is located in the south-east of the city in Schwechat. It takes approx. 25-30 min. by train to the city center ("Landstraße – Wien Mitte"). There are several possibilities to get to the city center with public transport: express trains, the special airport train (CAT) or bus lines. The fares are moderate starting from € 5,-. You can get a cab at the airport as well, yet the fare for a cab ride is at least € 30,- or more.

**By train**

The train is a comfortable way to travel to Vienna. The ÖBB (Austrian Federal Railways) offer trains from various major European cities. All international trains arrive at Vienna Main Station ("Hauptbahnhof"), where you have various connections to public transport (metro, buses, trams and cabs).

### By car

As tolls are compulsory on all motorways and expressways in Austria, you will also need a vignette to use Vienna's city motorways.

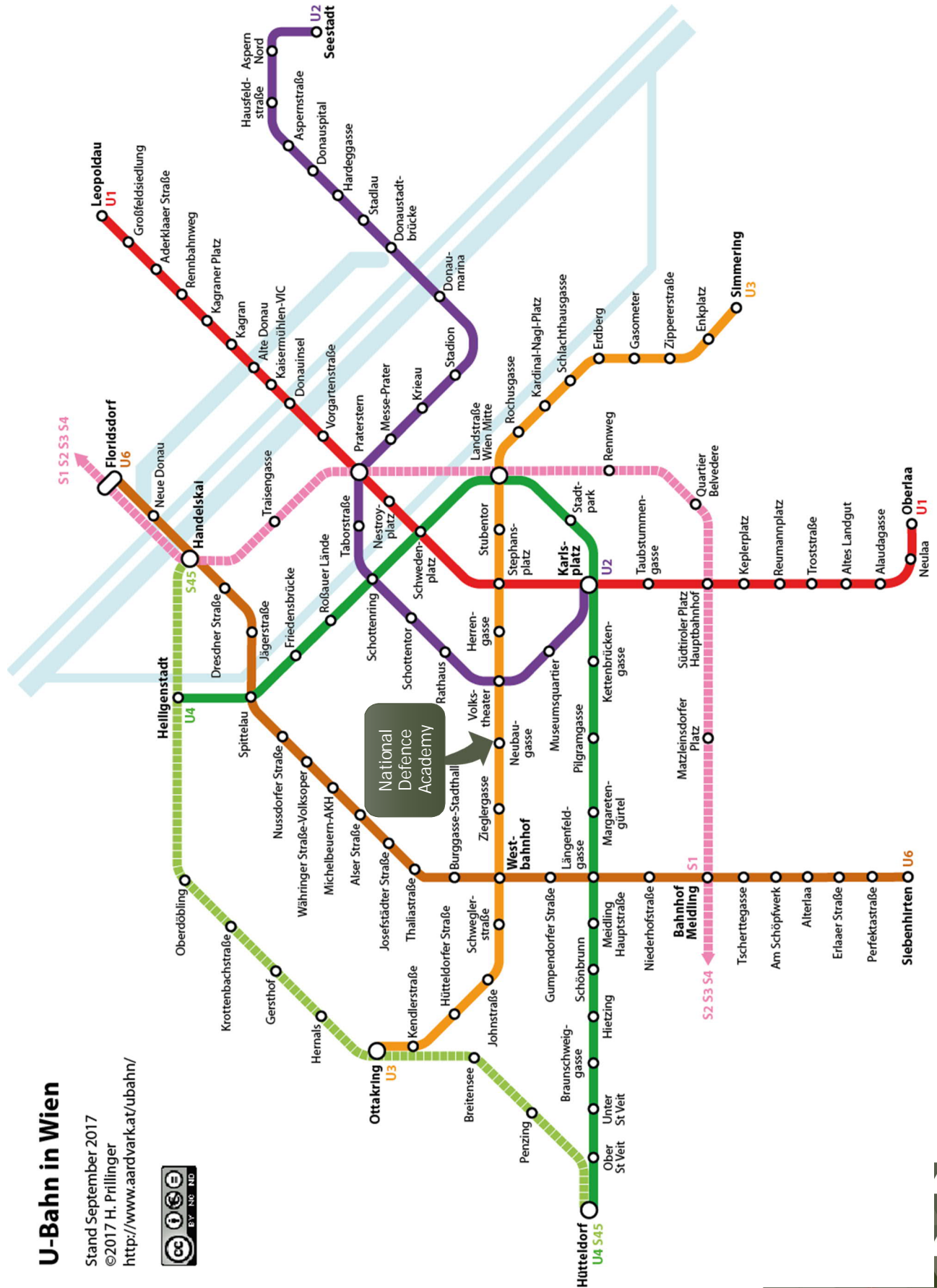

## ABOUT VIENNA<sup>1</sup>

Vienna is a picturesque city in the very heart of Europe. The city impresses its visitors with its imperial past and Habsburg charm, yet still has a vivid modern and urban culture.

The suggested hotels are placed on or near the main shopping street of Vienna, the Mariahilfer Straße. Here you find everything you need within walking distance. If you'd like to enjoy some of Vienna's marvellous sightseeing attractions, take a walk to the **Hofburg**, which used to be the palace of the Habsburg Dynasty. If you'd like to have some coffee in a traditional Austrian "coffee house", the **Café Central** is only a short walk away from Hofburg. If you're spending some more time in Vienna, some other interesting sights are the **Schönbrunn Palace** and the **Saint Stephen's Cathedral**.

Vienna is in the Central European time zone (CET = GMT / UCT + 1). Daylight saving time applies from the last Sunday in March to the last Sunday in October (CEST).

Electricity

The typical mains voltage for households (as well as hotels) in Vienna is 230 volts (alternating current)

The telephone prefix for calling Vienna from other countries is: + 43 1

Language

German is spoken in Austria, and the most commonly spoken foreign language is English.

### Shops

Shops are usually open Mon-Fri from 9.00 am - 6.30 pm, Sat until 5.00 pm or 6.00 pm; some shopping centers are open until 8.00 pm or 9.00 from Mon-Fri.

Shopping is available on Sundays and holidays at the large railway stations, at the airport and in the museum shops.

### Banks

Most banks in Vienna are open from Monday to Friday from 8.00 am to 12.30 pm and from 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm, and until 5.30 pm on Thursdays. In the city centre (1st district), almost all banks are open over lunchtime.

### Restaurants and hot food

Most restaurants in the city centre are open daily. Hot food is generally offered from 11.00 am - 2.00 pm and from 6.00 pm - 10.00 pm. Many restaurants also serve hot food throughout the day. Some restaurants, often outside the city centre, are closed on one day each week, sometimes on Sundays as well. Night-owls can silence late or even early hunger pangs at a typical Viennese sausage stand. More on Vienna's restaurants:

### Drugstores

Drugstores are open from Monday to Friday from 8.00 am - 6.00 pm, usually without a lunch break, and on Saturday from 8.00 am - 12.00 noon. Outside of these times, a 24-hour drugstore standby service is available throughout the city. Details of the nearest open drugstore are posted at every drugstore.
